- 1. Finding a topic
- 2. Onboarding
- 3. Agreeing on a supervision schedule
- 4. Literature search
- 5. Drafting exposé/roadmap/timeline
- 6. Programming, experiments
- 7. Seminar talk
- 8. Drafting thesis outline
- 9. Writing the thesis
- 10. Handing in
- 11. Publication

Communicate with the supervisor for each of these steps

Official formalities: Anmeldung

- Marks the official begin of the thesis
- □ Fill in the official form (Studienbüro), have it signed (supervisor) and submit to Studienbüro
- The specified title is final
- Thesis submission deadline is implied by start date
- See Studien- und Prüfungsordnung for details on requirements and the time you get
- There will be no explicit confirmation from Studienbüro

Optimal moment for Anmeldung is individual; might be after the experiments work

Official formalities: Seminar talk

- Main objective: Getting a broader feedback on the thesis progress
- Some experiments should already have been done
- Preparation for the talk helps to structure the final thesis
- Optimally at 2/3 of the thesis progress
- Coordinate presentation date with supervisor (needs to be present) and discuss slides upfront
- 25 min presentation, 10 min discussion
- Talk is graded; Prüfungsbüro will be notified by us

Official formalities: Handing in the thesis

- Deadline is important
- Thesis must be printed (multiple copies, see instructions of Studienbüro)
- □ More formalities (front page, declaration, ...)
- Hand in with Studienbüro
- Must submit digital copy including supplementary material (code, models) to Studienbüro
- Online repositories or cloud storage are not sufficient
- Must also submit digital copy and supplementary material (code, models) to supervisor

Publication

- Supervisor will contact you to put thesis on the Webis page
- University recommends to submit to ul.qucosa.de
- Thesis might be a good starting point for a research paper
