Making Your Presentation

- ❑ Presentation time:
 - 25 minutes to present
 - 10 minutes to discuss
- ❑ Slide structure follows that of your thesis
 - Motivation/problem description
 - Related work
 - Methods
 - Experimental Setup
 - Results
 - Conclusion
- ❑ Audience should learn something from your presentation
